






Composer

A composer (<u>Latin compōnō</u>; literally "one who puts together") is a <u>musician</u> who is an <u>author</u> of <u>music</u> in any form, including <u>vocal music</u> (for a <u>singer</u> or <u>choir</u>), <u>instrumental music</u>, <u>electronic music</u>, and music which combines multiple forms.

Scenic design (also known as scenography, stage design, or set design) is the creation of theatrical, as well as film or television scenery. Scenic designers come from a variety of artistic backgrounds, but in recent years, are mostly trained professionals, holding a B.F.A. or M.F.A. degrees in theater arts. Scenic designers design sets and scenery that aim to support the overall artistic goals of the production. There has been a consideration that scenic design is also production design; however, more accurately, it is a part of the visual production of a film or television.



Sound design

Sound design is the art and practice of creating sound tracks for a variety of needs. It involves specifying, acquiring or creating auditory elements using audio production techniques and tools.

Music Director

A music director, musical director, or director of music is the person responsible for the musical aspects of a performance, production, or organization



Lighting technician

Lighting technicians are responsible for the movement and set up of various pieces of lighting equipment for separation of shadow or light and contrast, depth of field or visual effects. Lighting Technicians may also lay electrical cables. wire fixtures, install color effects or image patterns, focus the lights, and assist in creating effects or programming sequences..

Theatrical **production management** is a sub-division of stagecraft. The production management team (consisting of a production manager and any number of assistants) is responsible for realizing the visions of the producer and the or within constraints of technical possibility.

Property master



The property master, often called the prop(s) master, is an and organizational employee in a , or production who is responsible for purchasing, acquiring, manufacturing, properly placing, and/or overseeing any needed for a production.

Stagehand

A **stagehand** is a person who works backstage or behind the scenes in theatres, film, television, or location performance. Their work include setting up the scenery, lights, sound, props, rigging, and special effects for a production.

Technical director

A **technical director** (**TD**) is usually a senior technical person within e.g. a software company, engineering firm, film studio, theatre company or television studio. This person usually has the highest level of skill within a specific technical field.

Theatrical technician

theatrical technician. (variably known a tech, technician, theatre tech or theatre technician) is a person who operates technical equipment and systems in the and , this broad category contains all contrast to "unseen" theatrical personnel who practice and are responsible for the logistic and production-related aspects of a performance including designers, operators, and supervisors. 
Wardrobe supervisor
